Global Citizenship in partnership with Oxfam

The purpose of the programme is to improve understanding of the concept of Global Citizenship. The package consists of a core module which provides an overview of global citizenship. The core module demonstrates the stages of global citizenship education:

- Being knowledgeable and informed
- Developing the skills to think critically, build empathy with others and evaluate situations
- Taking action on global citizenship issues which affect themselves and others

A further five modules cover a range of themes and issues such as rights based health, climate change and sustainability, peace and conflict, globalisation and interdependency and aid and development.

You are encouraged to understand your role as a global citizens and reflect on the role of your organisation in responding to and upholding the values and targets of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, the ground breaking legislation in Wales - the Well being for Future Generations Act and the implementation of the Charter for International Health Partnerships.

COVID-19 Pfizer (Comirnaty 10 microgram/dose for children and young people ages 5-11 years)

From January 2022, the Pfizer-BioNTech Comirnaty 10 micrograms/dose COVID-19 vaccine will be supplied for the immunisation of eligible children aged 5 to 11 years of age.

This e-learning session provides specific information about the Pfizer-BioNTech Comirnaty 10 micrograms/dose COVID-19 vaccine. It is designed to provide healthcare workers involved in delivering this vaccine to children aged 5 to 11 years with the knowledge they need to safely and effectively deliver it.

This session will cover key information including how the vaccine works, which children are eligible, contraindications and precautions, how the vaccine should be stored, prepared and administered and potential vaccine reactions. The Core Knowledge session covers key areas including legal aspects of vaccination including consent. The Core Knowledge session must therefore be completed in addition to this vaccine-specific session if you have not already completed it.

COVID-19 Activity

During the COVID-19 Pandemic the team have supported Public Sector Wales to access a number of e-learning modules to ensure that staff and volunteers undertook the appropriate training prior to commencing their placements.

The DLW Team have also supported Welsh Government in the development of an interactive Workforce Risk Assessment toolkit which allowed staff to assess their risk to COVID-19.




New look and feel for new courses


Courses are being refreshed in a new look and design based on user feedback. We continue to engage in user feedback to inform future changes. Here are some of the new designs.
